#### **SCAST Trial Results**

The SCAST trial results were presented at the International Stroke Conference, Los Angeles and published in the Lancet in February 2011:

SCAST was neutral, although there was a negative trend. The results are internally consistent, and externally consistent with earlier trials (see the meta-analysis in the paper). However, the results are difficult to understand since the BP changes were relatively smaller, the drug was weaned up from a low dose over the first few days, and candesartan has shown neuroprotective properties in pre-clinical stroke models.

The Data Monitoring Committee have been asked to consider the SCAST results in the context of the ENOS and other trial data. But the results suggest that it is very important that ENOS (and INTERACT-2) continue so that the stroke community gets definitive results about acute BP management. Please also remember that ENOS is testing a very different agent from SCAST and that previous studies show that nitric oxide, as released from GTN, has specific brain effects on brain blood flow and brain cells.


patients (from 124 recruiting sites, 1,087=49% in the continue-stop part) and we are on target to reach 3,500 by October 2013.
